Pleasure for men, by men

All-male massage parlour gives sex service to its customers

AN all-male massage parlour in Kuala Lumpur allegedly provides sex service to its male customers. *Oriental Daily* reported after one of its writers went undercover recently following a complaint from a reader.

According to the report, the centre, which has 13 male masseurs, only serves men.

Most of the masseurs are from Vietnam and Myanmar but apparently not all of them provide

sex service.

One of the masseurs admitted that he charged RM50 to RM150 per session for sex.

The masseur claimed that he could earn additional RM200 to RM300 with the "extra service" he provided every day.

He added that the centre operator would not interfere in their business nor ask for commissions for the "extra work" they rendered to their customers.

When contacted, a senior police officer urged the public with information to lodge reports so that action could be taken to stop the vice activities.

> Penang singing star Jeryl Lee Pei Ling plans to take a break from studies and pursue her singing career in China, *China Press* reported.

It was learnt that the Form Four student at Chung Ling High School had submitted the application to the school.

The 17-year-old and her mother, Ivy Liew, could not be reached for comment.

When contacted, her manager said he would make sure Jeryl continued with her studies, regardless of whether she chose to stay in Kuala Lumpur or China.

He said Jeryl was also working on her first album.

Car accident victims' kin warn of fake donation drive

THE children of a couple who died in a car accident last week were shocked to find out that someone had been soliciting donations in their names, reported *Malaysia Nanyang*.

The couple were on their way back from Port Klang after sending off their son M. Sankaran when their car collided head on with another.

Within days of the tragedy, it was claimed that an opportunist unrelated to the family began spreading a social media message containing a bank account number, claiming to be collecting donations on behalf of the family.

Sankaran said the family was not seeking donations. He urged the public not to give any money to the fraudster. He has also lodged a police report over the matter.

> Police in Uttar Pradesh, India, found several mobile phone shops selling the contact numbers of attractive women to strangers, reported *Tamil Nesan*.

Following rising complaints about harassment through handphones, police found that shops were selling the women's handphone numbers.

Workers reportedly noted down the numbers when the women came in to top-up credit or to have the devices repaired.

The numbers were then sold for up to 500 rupees (RM32) each.
